Translation... Thank you for your recent prayers as three from Boiling Springs Baptist travelled to Xela, Guatemala in October.

Melvin and Joann Lutz and I are grateful for your prayers and concern as we were away learning more about the work of the Good Shepherd Orphanage, Medical Clinic and Training Center. We are excited to announce that on Wednesday night November 29, we will be sharing about our experience at 6PM in the Lighthouse room. The church family, including children and youth are invited to come together for this special time. Flyers regarding this work in Guatemala can be picked up on the table outside the church office.

Announcing new and additional time for weekly prayer and Bible Study – On Sunday, November 5, Daylight Savings Time ends, and our evenings begin getting dark very early.
