#### KEITH'S KORNER

The saying "Don't waste a good crisis" is often attributed to Winston Churchill, but most likely has its origins elsewhere. As I reflect on our unwanted and unwelcome COVID crisis, I am reminded personally and collectively I/we must not waste this once-in-a-lifetime, or once-in-a-generation opportunity to learn and grow.

I recently participated in a national Zoom webinar led by Dr. Bill Wilson, Director for Center for Healthy Churches, who said the following: "fundamentally rethinking what it means to be the church is a once-in-ageneration opportunity." Bill was challenging pastors and churches not to rush back into business as usual, but to spend time in prayer, thought, and conversation about the true essence of why we are here and doing what we are doing as a church. Regardless of where or how churches are worshiping right now, these conversations are important.

On Sunday, August 9 and 16, at 5:00 p.m. on Zoom, I invite you to join me in a roundtable discussion I am titling *New Lessons/New Opportunities: What Is God Saying to You and Us During This Time, and What Lessons Are We Learning?* What new opportunities for ministry might the Spirit be leading us into? This time has no agenda and is not a decision-making group, but I do hope our conversations, combined with the Spirit of God, will lead us down paths that will help us become the best "fruit bearers" in our day and into the future. To help whet our appetite for these conversations, I plan to pass along some helpful links in the Weekly Updates as we move toward these times of discussion.

#### A few quick comments and updates as we look ahead:

First, on a personal note, thank you so much for your prayers and concern for my dad. These last few months have not been easy for dad or the family as he has declined in health. Conversations are now different with dad, and his physical ability is very weak. I very much appreciate your continued prayers as my sister and I navigate a new path for dad and his continued care. Dad's current healthcare facility went from no cases of COVID to over 55. I am thankful that he has remained COVID-free and certainly hope and pray this continues.

The COVID Transition Team here at BSBC has been meeting weekly, and remains hard at work establishing new policies and procedures for when we do come back inside for worship. We are also looking at procedures for other meeting opportunities. A summary, and the current status of our work will be presented to the deacons at the August meeting. No date has been set for in-person inside worship, and we continue to monitor the situation.

Drive-In Worship (Sundays at 9:00 a.m.) and Zoom Worship (Sundays at 11:00 a.m.) continue to go well and provide two opportunities for our church family to be together in a worship environment. We are one church offering two avenues for worship with opportunities for participation. Zoom worship has allowed for those to join in who live in different areas of our state and from across the ocean in Scotland! Join us for one or both of these worship services.

The Youth Minister Search Committee, in consultation with the Personnel Committee, has been hard at work and could be announcing a candidate to the deacons in August. This individual met with our youth, parents, and leaders (via Zoom) on Wednesday, July 29.

Each Sunday at 11:00 a.m., several of our congregation members and friends click on the Zoom link and join together in worship in a Zoom Room. It looks more like the Brady Bunch than a room; but, we are able to see one another and participate in worship together.

Only four months ago, I didn't even know what Zoom was. At this point, I cannot even begin to count the number of meetings via Zoom in which I have participated.

These days we're even offering a Zoom worship opportunity! Typically we ring a bell and light a candle to begin our worship together. There are other parts in the service led by various church members as well as a musical offering.

As we all know the world we live in has changed dramatically on many levels. Businesses we used to rely on for necessities and entertainment; venues for social and religious gatherings have been closed or are partially inaccessible. Libraries are no exception. However, for those who love to read books, there is a way to have access to a plethora of reading material, right in your own home, known as eBooks (electronic books.) Simply put, an eBook is a book converted to a digital format to be read on any digital device such as a computer screen, tablet or smartphone. To be able to buy eBooks, to download and store them permanently, one must have a device called an eReader. Three of the most popular are Amazon Kindle, Rakuten's Kobo, and Barnes & Noble's Nook. To purchase and download an eBook on the eReader one must set up an account using a bank credit card which will be charged with each purchase. Many books are free but the average cost of a book is between \$3.00 and \$5.00. Although eBooks are inexpensive, save space, the environment, are portable and have several other advantages over traditional books, hopefully there will always be a calming and thoughtful place called a "Library".
