A MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER TO ADULTS

Matthew has a good account of Jesus teaching to pray. It's included in his Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 6:5-14. Jesus is teaching those listening how to pray. He tells them that it's not for show, but go into a room, close the door and pray unseen. I believe corporate prayer is an important piece to our worship, but I hope that's not the only time someone prays. How important is your prayer life? Do you have a special place that you meet with God each day? It could be somewhere outside, or in your house, a special room or chair. If you do not have some where you regularly meet with God, I encourage you to find one or create one. Communicating with God is so important.

This month we will be having an emphasis on prayer in the small Bible study groups. There will be six opportunities to get into a small group Bible study on prayer beginning the week of February 7. Currently all these groups will meet at the church.

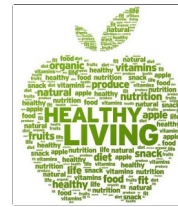

### 40 Day New Testament Listening Challenge to Begin Feb 10

In just 28 minutes a day for 40 days you can listen through the entire New Testament. Reading through the New Testament is a great goal, but have you ever listened to the entire New Testament? What a great way to prepare our hearts and minds for Easter! If you would like to join with others from BSBC to listen through the NT during the season of lent you are welcome to pursue one of the following options for doing this.

- Pick up a copy of the New Testament on a free MP3 disc located in church office or at welcome desk in sanctuary lobby. A MP3 disc can be played in cars approximately 2007 and up, any CD player labeled MP3 compatible, on your computer or in your DVD player.
- Download a Bible listening app to your smart phone or tablet. We recommend the free Bible.is app.
- You can purchase a Biblestick listening device for \$24. An example of this can be found in the church office during the week or at the welcome desk in the church lobby on Sunday mornings. This is a very small device with comfortable ear buds that would work great while you are walking, etc.

Also, if you own a copy of the NT on CD or tape and would be willing for someone to borrow it, please let the church office know. It is our goal to help everyone have the necessary tools to accept and accomplish the challenge.

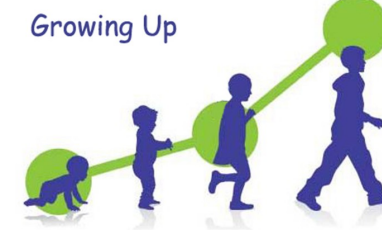

## MUSIC NOTES FROM ROGER LOWE

*O come, let us sing unto the Lord: let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation. (Psalm 95:1)*

Before the Reformation, the congregation of a church did not sing, they only listened as music was performed, mostly in Latin, so few had any idea of the meaning of the songs. As hymn singing was introduced in the new Protestant churches, the songs were catchy and the lyrics simple, easy to remember, and carried a lot of theological weight. Therefore, hymn singing was a teaching tool for the commoner to memorize important truths of Christianity. Think about your own journey of faith. Certainly there have been songs that have given you hope during difficult times, and songs that you have lifted up to the Lord in joy.

One of the things Keith, Linda and I have tried to accomplish in worship planning is having balance in the hymn selections each week—some new, some old and some contemporary songs that aren't in the hymnal. We also try to select music for all aspects of the service that are connected to the message being preached so that there is an overall theme. This is especially true for the selection of congregational hymns. Sometimes there is an obvious connection, and sometimes we choose praise music or songs that only touch on the subject of the sermon. Other times we are drawn to music that is not explicitly on the topic of the sermon, but we trust that God is leading us to include it for a reason.

Being open to learning unfamiliar songs, whether from the hymnal or from words printed in the bulletin, allows you the chance to see if the Lord has a message there for you. I hope that you will find participating in congregational singing to be an important part of worship—both corporate and individual—and that it will serve to strengthen your faith by speaking to your heart and by communicating important truths.



In church music, Christmas seems to be barely over before it's time to work on Easter music. Since Easter comes early this year, we have already begun working on the Easter cantata—*Behold the Lamb* by Dennis and Nan Allen. The choir is excited to bring you this worshipful experience on Palm Sunday, March 20. Don't forget—we always have room for more voices in the choir. If you want to participate, we meet on Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m.

The Adult Handbell Choir will be playing for our morning worship service on Sunday, February 21. You will have the opportunity to hear some of the wonderful arrangements they will be taking to the NC Baptist Adult Handbell Festival. This year's festival will be held in Shelby at the LeGrand Center on February 26 & 27. If you are interested in playing handbells, please contact me or Lana Henkel.
