FROM THE PARISH NURSE COMMITTEE

Glaucoma is a disease that damages your eye's optic nerve. Many people have no idea that they have glaucoma until they have significant, irreversible vision loss. This is because this disease often has no symptoms until vision loss is extensive. Adults with no symptoms or risk factors for eye disease should get a baseline eye disease screening at age 40. People of any age who have symptoms or have diabetes or high blood pressure should see an ophthalmologist or optometrist now to determine how often to have eye exams. With early treatment, potentially blinding eye problems often have a good outcome.
