Guatemala 2019

A mission team will be headed back to Guatemala, August 3-10, 2019, to assist in the construction of a planned second cottage for older children, and a small ministry director's house (Missions Committee unanimously blessed this effort in their September meeting). Both are located on the site of the beautiful Good Shepherd Center, where teams will be housed and fed. Teams will have supervision and work with Guatemalans on-site. A variety of construction skills are needed. Construction teams will have the opportunity for two of their female members to reside and serve for 48-hour stretches at



the Good Shepherd Children's Home to give the Guatemalan staff members some much needed time off.

Please be in prayer regarding your possible participation on this mission trip. Two informational meetings will take place on Sunday, December 9, at 9AM and another at 3PM, both in the Kerygma room (you would only need to attend one). Ideal team size is 8-13 individuals, with the limit being 13, due to transportation while in Guatemala.
