The Year of Jubilee - Hitting the Reset Button



Beginning in January 2020, Boiling Springs Baptist can benefit from time spent around the Old Testament theme of Jubilee. The Year of Jubilee was God's big 'Reset' button – it was the 'Reboot' in the system, the 'Ctrl-Alt-Del' in the universe.

Jubilee is the Sabbath of Sabbaths. In Leviticus 25 (I'm sure this book is part of your regular devotional reading, LOL) we learn of the significance of Jubilee. It follows a cycle of 7 Sabbath years. We are familiar with a weekly Sabbath (7th day) and may have heard of the significance of the Sabbath year being the Sabbatical year. After 7 Sabbatical years (49 years) one has great reason to pause and reset the clock as it were. This 50-year time span roughly acknowledges the span of a generation. Themes of rest and forgiveness permeate in the year of Jubilee! Jubilee is announced and begins on the annual day of atonement in that 50th year. Atonement cleanses the temple and community, making room for a fresh start. Let's pray for one another as we seek to experience a fresh start in 2020.

Boiling Springs Baptist Lenten Devotional Project for 2020

As we make plans and look forward to Easter 2020, would you be interested in writing a devotional to be included in a 40-day Lenten devotional guide?

April 12, 2020 (Easter) is a few months away, but now is the time to prepare for what has the potential to be a very meaningful and inspirational project for our church family. Let's Talk about Mortality

In this class, we will begin with a Death Café, discuss physician Atul Gawande's provocative book *Being Mortal: Medicine and What Happens in the End*, and explore the issue of how Christians should regard their mortal bodies and what to do with them after death.

Dr. June Hobbs, the facilitator for this class, has for many years taught a successful seminar at Gardner-Webb University called Death in American Culture. She is also a member of a collaborative research team sponsored by the Louisville Institute that is involved in a three-year project titled "A Practical Theology of Corpse Care."

This study will be offered for six Sunday nights at 5:00 pm beginning January 12. We will meet in the Fellowship Hall. Childcare will be provided.
