FROM OUR ASSOCIATE PASTOR FOR MUSIC & ADULTS

We are coming up on what has traditionally been an extremely busy time of year in our congregation. In certain respects, this year will be no different and in other ways, we will need to navigate things in a different way. We ask for your prayers and patience during this trying time and we, as a staff, pledge to try to communicate as best we can. If you have not signed up to receive church emails, texts, and/or phone calls, please do so at your earliest convenience. Through these avenues, as well as through the church Facebook group and Twitter, we will best be able to communicate quickly and as needed. It is a good idea for you to monitor or sign-up for at least two of these methods so that if you miss news or updates in one platform, you may catch it in another.

Deacon ordination for Elizabeth Pack is scheduled for November 15. Due to coronavirus concerns and safety precautions, we will not lay hands on her in the traditional way. Elizabeth's mother, Shirley Bridges, will represent all of us during the time of ordination; however, we ask that you write a special message to Elizabeth and bring it by the church prior to or on November 15. These notes will be delivered to her home at the conclusion of worship the day of ordination.

November 29 is the first Sunday of Advent, the date we have traditionally held a service for Hanging of the Greens. Due to health concerns, we will have an abbreviated celebration, part of which will take place during the 11:00 am service. Then at 5:00 pm that same day, we will have a mini-celebration of the lighting of the outdoor Christmas trees. You are invited to park your vehicle in either of our parking lots so you will have a view of the trees or you may bring a lawn chair and sit on the front lawn to view the lighting and to hear some scripture and a little music. This will be an abbreviated service so make your plans to arrive a little early or on time. If you are late, you may miss your favorite part of the event.

I want to express my gratitude and appreciation to all of you for the faith and trust you have placed in me and in my abilities as I serve in the position of Pre-Interim Interim. I am humbled by your confidence in me and with God's guidance, I will do my very best to be attentive to the needs and nurturing of our congregation. I am also counting on all of you to help with communication, pastoral care, and other needs along the way. I have often suggested that the church is like a team. We need each other in order to continue to move this church forward and into the next stage of ministry to which God is calling us.


