Yeah, it's true I may not be the one you would want to show in the OSHA training video at work, but I am safe. Right?

While alone at Dad's on a Saturday I decided it was time to tackle the cleaning and repair work needed on a section of his gutters. All was well until I decided to come down the ladder. The gutters were now clean, and I had hosed them down to make sure. What I failed to

As we look toward the fall our children's program will continue as it has this summer. The bags will be available to be picked up from the prayer room on Sunday or any day convenient for families. It has been an unusual but busy summer and we have learned many new things about Jesus and the people in the Bible. Fall bags will continue for the next several months.

Our **Go! Glow! Grow! For Jesus** bags for September will be ready for initial pick-up on September 6. The bags will contain crafts and activities ready for you and your children to work on. There will be activity sheets, coloring pages, and crafts that go with the story for each week in one pick-up. The individual bags will be labeled for each Sunday as well as for different ages.
