As the Hebrew people left their familiar life in Egypt for the unfamiliar life of the Promised Land, they had no idea of the events that would play out along the way. Leaving the known and entering the unknown has never been easy for any generation or group in all recorded history. It's tough!

On Friday, March 13, I was part of a difficult meeting with staff and our Parish Nurse Committee in which we decided to cancel the following Sunday's services and activities due to what we were learning about the coronavirus. I'm not sure about the others, but I imagine I wasn't the only one feeling as though we were about to enter an unfamiliar and uncertain time. After all, there is no

protocol for a situation like this. Navigating a church through a pandemic was not something I learned in Divinity School.

As I think about the journey of the Hebrew people and our present-day journey through the coronavirus, I'm asking God, why can't He just provide bread from heaven once again? No grocery store trip would be needed if we could just walk outside each morning and collect what we needed for the day \bigcirc . And for direction, the pillar of cloud by day and fire by night would sure be nice!

As we continue this unknown wilderness journey the coronavirus has us on, we are asked to do the same thing that was asked of the people of God thousands of years ago: trust Him. Sounds so easy, doesn't it?

In Joshua 1:6-9, Moses has passed, and the Lord is now instructing Joshua. He repeats (three times!) a message that we all need to hear today—"be strong and courageous." In verse 9, He says, "be strong and courageous, do not tremble or be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." Not only is God with us, His word tells us that He does not "become weary or tired" (Isaiah 40:28) and "He will never leave you nor for sake you" (Deuteronomy 31:8). The promises of God are the same for every generation and for all time. Amid the unknown and the uncertainty we find ourselves living in, I am choosing to put my trust in the One who loves me and walks beside me.

In closing, it grieves my heart to think of not being together on Easter Sunday, April 12. I am exploring possible options for something different and creative for this day. As we are preparing to print *The Current*, we know of one confirmed case of coronavirus in Boiling Springs, 636 in NC, and 456 in SC. These numbers will seem like ancient history very quickly as the virus continues to spread. BSBC has joined the fight to keep the spread under control. No doubt, you are aware that all activities and services at the church building are suspended. Sunday School classes are meeting online using Zoom and YouTube, Sunday morning worship services are being posted to YouTube, and many are using the old-fashioned phone call to stay in touch.

Church office hours are now M-F 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., and subject to change. Please limit your visits to only when necessary. The inside lobby metal doors will stay locked, and a tray will be placed on the table for offerings and other items. Press the button on the speaker box on the wall by the window to talk to Heidi. Food Pantry visitors are now being served outside. In order to keep the church office open and the ministry of the church operating, we need everyone to keep their distance for the time being. The ministers and staff of BSBC are adapting as quickly as possible to this ever-changing situation, and ask for your prayers and your patience during this challenging time. Remember—anyone can spread this virus without even knowing they are infected. Let's all work together to stay healthy and protect each other.

In the meantime, BSBC continues to serve the Boiling Springs community through keeping the Daycare operating for as long as possible (caring for the children of first responders), keeping the Food Pantry stocked (we have always served many families, and more need help now), and staying connected as a church body to uplift and support each

other (whether it's through encouragement or crisis assistance). Church committees are encouraged to stay in touch and be aware of ways they can help. As always, your tithes and offerings help to keep the ministries of the church going. Giving online is easy, just look for the Online Giving button on the church website, or in the Weekly Update.
